Our Curriculum

'Our' children are growing up in a world which is changing and developing very quickly. Our size allows us to respond flexibly to learners as individuals; identifying individual strengths, needs and learning styles, and developing creative learning opportunities to match these.

Key Stage 3

KS3 learners access a range of provisions, with most learners spending some time in their school. KS3 transition provides a core curriculum - English, maths, science and ICT, with humanities and a 'learning for learning' curriculum.

Key Stage 4

All learners follow a core curriculum which comprises English, maths and science, with ICT, religious studies and vocational options.

Pupil Premium

The Bridge Education Centre provides support for any schools that refer learners to us. The referring schools use their Pupil Premium Funding to send learners to The Bridge and as such the funding is used to provide personalised education for the learners in that way. The commissioning fees that the school receives are used to personalise learning through incentives, specialist tutors, college days and other similar items. This has helped learners improve their attainment.
